4. A Miniature is to be no more than 75 sq cm or 12 sq in Subjects are to be in proportion within a drawn frame.
5. Abstract means "to draw from" or "to select".
6. A collage means two-dimensional work on paper using a variety of additional materials
7. Mixed media means the use of 2 or more colouring medium in one exhibit.
